



DATES/TIMES:

- Games will begin within 30 minutes of check-in times.

For all events, the exact pairing systems will be determined when the rosters are finalized. Generally, I will try to have each division size be the tourney length +1, so that we play a true Round Robin. For each event the number of registrants is capped at 40 players, Gibson Rule used if needed, and NWL23 lexicon used. These will be fully rated NASPA tournaments.

Players must be active NASPA members. Visit www.scrabbleplayers.org to renew your NASPA membership.

PRIZES: All money from entry fees (less ratings fees to NASPA) is returned as cash prizes. Prizes awarded to 1st and 2nd places in every division, and 3rd place in divisions of 8 players. A “High Loss” prize is also awarded in each division for each round. **There will also be a special prize of a custom-made metal tile rack awarded to the single**

player who wins the most games over the whole weekend (regardless of which divisions played in) -- see end of this flyer for pictures.

EQUIPMENT: Please bring your boards, tiles, and clocks. If there is not enough equipment, players who have brought equipment will have play-priority over those who did not (and those stuck without equipment will have to forfeit rounds).

VENUE: Room 3550 in the Mell Classroom Building attached to Auburn University's Ralph B. Draughton Library. It can be tricky finding this particular classroom in the labyrinthine building, so below I am giving directions on how to reach the "atrium" in the Mell Classroom building. Our playing room is up the giant zigzag stairs from the atrium (which most players have been to in the past).

The library opens at exactly 9:00am on Saturday and 11:00am on Sunday (hence the start times of those events). **No parking tags are needed to park on the campus after after 5:30pm Friday or anytime during the weekend.** Easiest access is to park on the top level (open sky above you) of the parking deck off Roosevelt Drive. When you walk into the library's South Entrance, go past the circulation desk to the elevator. Take the elevator to the 2nd Floor, and upon exiting the elevator go LEFT (if you've taken the stairs, go RIGHT). You will pass by a Panera Bread restaurant and go down stairs to the atrium. (You should also be able to ask any library employee where the "Mell Classroom Building Atrium" is.) You *are* allowed to bring food into the library if you want to bring your own food or snacks.

HOTELS: If anyone is planning to stay the night in Auburn before, between, or after the events, there are plenty of hotel choices. The closest would be The Hotel at Auburn University which is, literally, right across College Street from the Ralph B. Draughton Library. Less expensive choices are available, including plenty near the interstate (Exit #51) on South College Street (taking College Street north, away from the I-85 exit, leads you directly toward the university/library/parking deck). AirBnB is an option, too, of course.

PAYMENT/REGISTER: To tentatively register, send me, Eric Harshbarger, an email at eric@ericharshbarger.org (or text me at 334-821-6616) stating your intent to show up. You must at least tentatively register by 11:59pm, Thursday, 3 December. If you are sure which of the events you will be playing in, you may pay me the appropriate entry fee total beforehand via Paypal (to the email address above). If you are unsure which events you will be participating in, you may also just bring cash and pay me at the appropriate check-in time.
